Advocacy is a core value driving the function of ALA, and the EB offers one face of that advocacy. Much of my work since I "retired" has been in the advocacy arena, specifically at the local level supporting the reconstitution of school libraries in the Houston Independent School District. While I have always worked on advocacy initiatives within AASL and ALA, the Houston Students Need Libraries effort was intensely hands-on, focusing on an audience that largely saw no need to restore libraries to the campuses. And we succeeded–school librarians were added as required staff members in every school in fall of 2022. Just as here at ALA with TAG, persistence has been key – I am certainly persistent.

Over my 44 years of membership, I have held many roles in ALA, especially AASL. But my most recent work with the ALA Ecosystem Initiative has clarified my understanding of our need within and beyond ALA to encourage librarians to speak with ONE VOICE, to reach both across our siloes internally and to the non-librarian public whether those are legislators or patrons. I appreciate how easy it is to focus on our personal niche while losing track of the big ee ess of the Right to Rea
