This year, National Library Workers Day (**NLWD**) will be celebrated on **April 11, 2017**. The original resolution to begin the celebration was proposed to recognize the hard work, dedication, and expertise of library support staff and librarians. It was proposed that the Tuesday of National Library Week be designated the day; and, that on that day, interested library workers, library groups, and libraries should advocate for better compensation for all library workers. If the day coincides with the national celebration of Equal Pay Day, these individuals, groups, and libraries should recognize both days together.
